




# Tiddlywinks! - Boo!

***The Plumpty Dumpty Pumpkin* by Mary Serfozo.** Young Peter looks for the perfect pumpkin to make his jack-o-lantern.

***The Little Old Lady Who Was Not Afraid of Anything* by Linda Williams.** We shared this fun interactive story as a flannel board. The brave Little Old Lady must contend with a pumpkin head, wiggling pants and other objects following her in the woods and trying to scare her.

### Time for a rhyme


Five little pumpkins sitting on a gate.

### Opening rhyme:

Tick, tock, tick, tock, now I'm striking three o'clock. Cuckoo! Cuckoo! Cuckoo! (lift baby three times)
