




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

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Tiddlywinks! – Let's Eat!
Week of October 22, 2012



Tiddlywinks! is an interactive story time for children 36 months and younger with an adult. We focus on shorter picture books, rhymes and music, and of course, lots of interaction for a fun, lively story time!

I totally switched gears this week and decided to change my Tiddlywinks program after the Tuesday session. You'll find the books, rhymes and music we used this week below. The Tuesday group heard the original line-up, ***Sing!*** While, the Wednesday and Thursday groups heard the revised edition, ***Lets Eat!***



Here We Go Round the Mulberry Bush by Jane Cabrera. Sing along with this version of the well-known song featuring animals going to school, learning, going home, and getting ready for bed.

If You're Happy and You Know It by Jane Cabrera. An elephant, a monkey, and a giraffe join other animals to sing different verses of this popular song that encourages everyone to express their happiness through voice and movement.

Yuck! By Mick Manning. What's for supper? Wiggly worms, rotten eggs and raw fish are just a few of the things on the menu for some animal babies. But what will our baby eat for his supper?

Hi, Pizza Man! By Virginia Walter. While a young girl waits for the delivery of a hot pizza, she provides the appropriate animal sounds for a variety of pretend animal pizza deliverers.

The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle (told as a flannel board story) Follow hungry little caterpillar as he eats his way through a varied and very large quantity of food until, full at last, he forms a cocoon around himself and goes to sleep.

Time for a rhyme
