BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND and in celebration of National Library Week, Mentor Library is again partnering with Xpress Shredding of Mentor to host a one-day free event on Saturday, April 16.

Patrons and Mentor residents may bring up to 5 paper-storage boxes (grocery bags are

acceptable) of documents which will be loaded into locked bins, then into a secured truck and taken to Xpress's facility off Tyler Boulevard for destruction. The truck will be attended at all times by Xpress Shredding staff. After thorough shredding, the paper will be recycled.

The collection, which is open to Mentor Library patrons and residents of Mentor, will take place in the Main Library's auxiliary parking lot on the cor-

ner of Mentor Avenue and Sharonlee Drive. The event will be held rain or shine, and participants do not need to get out of their cars to unload.

Shredding service is provided at no charge to the library or participants.
