Where will your gnome roam this summer? Kids can decorate a gnome, send it to a friend or family member, and follow its adventures across the country (or even the world).



Book Clubs at Mentor Library


Some of our book clubs have returned to meeting in person, while others will chat via Zoom this month. Call the library to check how your book club is meeting.








